Inverlochy Castle

Imposing Georgian mansion, Capability Brown styled gardens. Country house rooms, opulent and comfortable. Friendly service, kilted staff.



The Royal Scotsman (Train)

From Edinburgh the luxury train travels through the Highlands of Scotland. Leisurely travel, stops to visit tourist sites (castles/distilleries etc.). Maximum 36 guests; mahogany cabins, twin or single, ensuite bathrooms. Edwardian style. Old fashioned service, first class, two dining rooms. One to seven nights duration.

Hebridean Princess (Cruise Ship)

A cruise ship which sails through the Western Isles. Recently used by Royalty for an eight day holiday in Scotland to celebrate the Queen's 80th birthday. Fabulous scenery, fishing ports, castles, islands (700 round the coast of Scotland), rocky inlets, rugged coastline. Maximum 48 guests with 38 crew. Elegant well appointed cabins. Duration, four to eight nights.
